Modals are those helping verbs, which express the 'mode' or 'manner' of the actions indicated by the main verbs They express modes such as ability, possibility, probability, permission, obligation, etc The most commonly used modals are shall, should, will, would, can, could, may, might, must, ought to, used to, need and dare

All modal verbs have some special characteristics you should remember: 1 they do not take an -S in the third person singular: you cannot say he cans or she wills 2 they are followed by an infinitive without 'to' in most cases, except OUGHT TO Ex: You ought to study more more if you want to pass the exam
